OUR STORY

Spread the Word Nevada was born out of the need to create home libraries for children living in economically disadvantaged communities.

When our founder, Laurie, was a librarian at a low-income elementary school here in Las Vegas, she saw firsthand the devastated looks on children's faces when they couldn't afford to purchase a new book from the school bookfair. This broke her heart, so she recruited our Co-Founder (and now CEO) Lisa, and together they created Spread the Word Nevada in 2001. They began serving one, then two, then a handful of schools. Their dream was to serve 10 schools...fast forward to today, and what started out as a nice, community project run out of Lisa's garage now operates out of a 13,000 sq. ft warehouse serving 78 schools across the state and thousands of children in need.

NEVADA'S LITERACY CRISIS

THE PROBLEM

The most recent NAEP reports that only 27% of Nevada's 4th graders are proficient readers.


Students who are not proficient readers by 3rd grade are 4x more likely to drop out of high school.

If those same students are living in poverty, they are 6x more likely to drop out of high school, and if they are Black or Hispanic, they are 8x more likely to drop out of high school.

The average high school dropout costs the economy approximately \$272,000 over his or her lifetime in terms of lower tax contributions, higher reliance on Medicaid and Medicare, higher rates of criminal activity, and higher reliance on welfare (Levin and Belfield 2007).

It is imperative that we get Nevada's students reading proficiently as fast as we can...but we're limited on space.

Our current building isn't capable of housing all the books and resources that we need in order to impact more students through our programming.





NEVADA'S LITERACY CRISIS

THE SOLUTION

The presence of books in the home is the largest predictor of whether a child will attain a high level of education – more significant than parents' education, occupation, or class.

STWN distributes over 70,000 books a month to 78 low-income elementary schools throughout the state, and provides four literacy based programs aimed at making Nevada's students strong and confident readers.

Our long-term literacy programs have had analyses completed by UNLV with results of 23.4% average increase in the number of proficient readers while receiving our multiple literacy services.

Our evidence-based interventions address these educational disparities and help Nevada's most vulnerable students.

A larger home-base building would allow STWN to expand the reach of our programs and impact the lives of thousands of children who are not currently receiving our services.







OUR NEW HOME

Spread the Word Nevada currently operates out of a 13,000 sq ft. building that has quickly become insufficient to house the millions of books coming through our warehouse, and the staff it takes to deliver our mission.

We are in escrow for a building in the heart of our city that is 2.5 times our current building size. This increase in square footage promises many benefits:

- Dual volunteer rooms will easily accommodate the increased number of community members it will take to prepare our books for distribution.
- Increased office space will allow current and future staff to meet and work collaboratively.
- Increased warehouse capacity will help house more books, space for processing, and allow for additional geographic expansion beyond just Clark, Washoe, & Elko counties.
- Spacious and inviting meeting rooms will allow us to host programs in our own facility, as well as host collaborative meetings with other community partners in both the nonprofit and for-profit sectors.

It is our dream forever home.




